

Academic Program for Master Degree Candidates in Global Health

Program overview

The Master of Medicine in Global Health (MMGH) in the Centre for Health Management and Policy Research is particularly designed to allow for rigorous training in an inquisitive and enabling environment where students from all over the world will bring their experience and expertise to understand the greatest health challenges facing the world today.

This two-year program consists of three parts. The first part mainly focuses on the training of Chinese language skill and experience of local culture and customs. The core part provides the students with a common knowledge base by offering a series of global health curriculums. The final part motivates students to put Global Health thinking into practice and acquire skills and practical knowledge via doing a master thesis. Together, this training package prepares students to become a catalyst for change as a global health professional.
